Below are the directions and instructions to help you take part. As you prepare to celebrate this year’s Advent season, let us ring the clarion bells of joy, hope, and faith from our homes to the homes of our neighbors. May God bless you.

4. If you choose to write a poem, please indicate the author.
5. You can also write a prayer based on any theme.
6. There is also the opportunity to write a commentary on a hymn of your choice.

3. Available December 3<sup>rd</sup>. First Sunday of Advent

The Bell Choir will be starting the seasonal session and is in need of ringers. Anyone interested in joining or in need of additional information please contact Hutch.

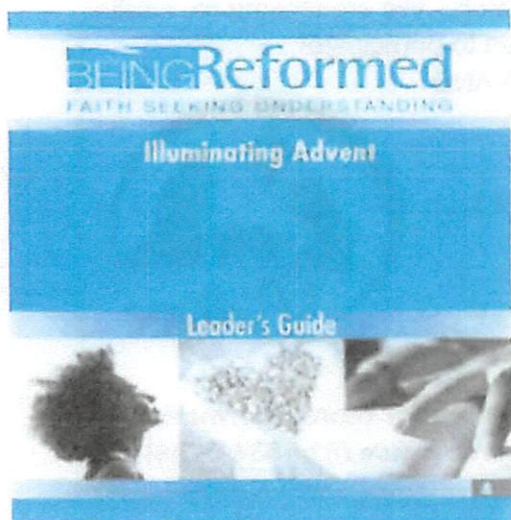

Many people ask what is costs to make a quilt, so here is an estimate:

1 quilt -----	2 yards of flannel	\$ 18.00
	2 yards of cotton fabric	\$ 20.00
	2 yards of batting	\$ 4.00
	<u>Miscellaneous</u>	<u>\$ 3.00</u>
	Total	\$45.00

Pocket quilts – approximately \$1.00 each

53 quilts were requested and made in 2024

17 NICU quilts

8 foster quilts

8 mission quilt

3,892 pocket quilts

This equals roughly \$ 3,870 for quilts and \$ 3,892 for pocket quilts for a total of \$7762.00. That is what we would pay if we didn't use coupons and shop sales. Our sock of donated fabric is helpful but much of it is outdated.

Other expenses in 2024: Sewing machine repair 10 – 12, Sergers 2 – 3

Batting 3 rolls of 60 yards each. Replaced damaged cutting table.

Thread, Computer fabric sheets, card stock, copy paper, crochette card for strings, canned air for cleaning sergers.

We accept donations, JoAnns coupons, your prayers for our ministry, and willing helpers to be part of our fund raising efforts.

As we are getting older and more limited health wise, we cannot do it alone. It will take a village to keep Prayers and Squares being the hands, feet and voice of our church.

## **The Westmont Presbyterian Church**

An excerpt from *Presbyterians in the Upper Conemaugh Valley* written for the 125<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the First Presbyterian Church by Donald H. Matthews, Jr in 1957

Continued from the October 2024 *Thread*.....Of this number, 173 were from First Church, 81 were from the Vine Street congregation, and 54 were from other churches or were received on confession of faith.

Dr. Hays noted that "few churches in our denomination have started out so well equipped in numbers and ability." Two of the first fifteen elders elected by the new congregation later returned to the mother church. One has since died and the other is still a member.

In accordance with the original understanding, the Rev. Mr. Roberts, a Welshman, became the pastor of the new church. The arrangement worked satisfactorily and the congregation had grown to more than to more 400 members when he resigned in 1935.

After a concerted search for a new pastor, The Rev. John Hubert Stanton was called from Scranton's Washburn Presbyterian Church. He is still serving the Hilltop group, which now has one of the most complete and comprehensive programs to be found in operation in any congregation. The youngest daughter commands respect and is looked upon with pride by the mother church of Johnstown Presbyterianism. The Westmont church is the fourth and by far the longest pastorate of Dr. Stanton.

The church, which has experienced a phenomenal growth since the close of World War II, a growth consistent with that of the Westmont-Southmont-Upper Yoder area which is its primary area of service, called its first assistant pastor in 1946. He was the Rev. William T. Doncaster, Jr., who served until 1948. A short time later he became pastor of St. Paul's Church in Somerset.

The Rev. David C. Newquist was called as associate pastor in the spring of 1957. He had been pastor at Shawnee-on-the-Delaware. The three years prior to Mr. Newquist's arrival Warren D. (Brook) Pfost served as administrative assistant. He came from Chambersburg Community House, Trenton, N.J., and left in the fall of 1956 to become community recreation director at Monroeville, near Pittsburgh.

Mr. and Mrs. Andrew L. Flanigan are the ministers of music at the church and have aided greatly with youth work through the organization of seven choirs. These are the Chancel, Westminster, Cathedral, Chapel, Crusaders, Carol and Celeste.

### **100 Years Ago**

During the winter of 1924-25, plans were laid for a building "which shall be creditable to the Presbyterian name and worthy of Westmont".
